BE READY FOR JUDGING BY 10.15 a.m. **The Hall will be cleared for Judging at
10.30 a.m.** Please bring your own vases, etc., for exhibiting purposes.

RULES

1. All floral and vegetable exhibits must be grown by Exhibitors in their own gardens or must have been in their possession for at least two months.
2. All entries to be given to the Secretary, Mrs Roseann Vince, 11 Sandpit Hill Cottages, Cholesbury, by the WEDNESDAY prior to the show. Late entries MAY be accepted but entries on the day 50p per entry.
3. No exhibitor may enter more than one entry per class
4. Any question of doubt or dispute to be submitted to the Show Committee for their decision, which shall be final.
5. All exhibits TO BE STAGED AND READY FOR JUDGING BY 10.15 a.m. Doors close at 10.30 a.m. for judging. Exhibitors to provide their own vases and dishes.
6. **NO EXHIBITS MAY BE REMOVED BEFORE COMPLETION OF THE PRIZE GIVING AND RAFFLE DRAW (approx. 4.00 p.m.).**
7. PRIZE MONEY not collected within one week of the show from Mrs Roseann Vince, Show Secretary, will be paid back into the Society's funds.
8. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
9. The Judges shall have the power to withhold or modify prizes if exhibits do not warrant the prizes offered.
10. Reasonable care will be taken of all exhibits, but the Committee will not be responsible for any loss, injury or damage to exhibitors/spectators/or exhibited items.
11. Please prepare exhibits as far as possible ready for staging in Hall, as space becomes congested.

DIVISION 3. FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS.

(NOTE: RULE 1 does not apply to this division. OASIS MAY BE USED FOR DISPLAYS)

45. AN ARRANGEMENT using fresh herbs, which may be in flower, not more than 18" overall
46. PETITE FLORAL ARRANGEMENT, not more than 9"× 9" maximum
47. AN ARRANGEMENT OF FLOWERS IN VARIOUS SHADES OF ONE COLOUR AND FOLIAGE, not more than 18" overall
48. AN ARRANGEMENT TO CELEBRATE THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY'S 70th ANNIVERSARY accessories may be used. Not exceeding 24"×24"×24"
49. A JUG OF FLOWERS FOR THE KITCHEN TABLE – not more than 18" overall
50. AN ARRANGEMENT IN A SINGLE CANDLE-HOLDER
51. AN ARRANGEMENT IN AN UNUSUAL CONTAINER. Not exceeding 24"×24"×24"
52. AN AUTUMN ARRANGEMENT OF SEED-HEADS AND FOLIAGE IN A BASKET OR TRUG. Space allowed 24"×24"×24"

CHILDREN'S CLASSES

DIVISION 4. OPEN TO CHILDREN ONLY, must reside in the Parish of Cholesbury cum St. Leonards or Bellingdon, or attend Hawridge School, or be Members' children.

NO ENTRANCE FEES. NAME and AGE TO BE STATED ON ENTRY. Age will be taken into account.

Classes for under 6 years

53. A PERSON MADE FROM RECYCLED MATERIALS - not exceeding 12" tall

54. PATTERN DRAWN IN CHALK - not larger than A4 size

Classes for 7–8 years

55. A COLLAGE – not larger than A4 in size

56. "PEBBLE PEOPLE" – 1 or more pebbles painted, or unpainted

Classes for 9–11 years

57. A STILL LIFE PICTURE in any medium, not larger than A4 in size

58. A PENCIL-POT, made by yourself

Classes open up to 15 years

59. A PHOTOGRAPH – mounted on card not larger than A4 in size

60. AN ARRANGEMENT OF FLOWERS IN A RECYCLED CONTAINER – not more than 12" tall

TWO SPECIAL CLASSES TO CELEBRATE THE 70th BIRTHDAY OF THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Points in the following two classes WILL NOT CONTRIBUTE to the Hodgson Children's Cup

Class a) Hawridge and Cholesbury Church of England School ONLY.

Each School Class to make a greetings card to celebrate the 70th Birthday of Cholesbury cum St. Leonards Horticultural Society

Class b) Open for ALL children up to 15 years.

A greetings card to mark the 70th Birthday of Cholesbury cum St. Leonards Horticultural Society (no larger than A4)

DIVISION 5. ARTS AND CRAFTS - PHOTOGRAPHY & PAINTINGS.

CLASSES 61–78: EXHIBITS NOT TO HAVE BEEN PREVIOUSLY SHOWN

61. HAND EMBROIDERY, using stranded cotton/silks or wool. (May be framed or made into an article.)

62. A HANDMADE ITEM TO CELEBRATE THE 75th ANNIVERSARY OF THE PARISH

63. A CUSHION – hand or machine-made

64. A GARMENT, hand or machine-made by yourself for a child under 2 years.

65. A STUFFED TOY (knitted, fabric, or crocheted), suitable for a small child (i.e. must not contain any hard accessories that may cause harm to a child)

66. A HOME-MADE CARD FOR A SPECIAL OCCASION - Any medium – e.g. lace-making, dried flowers, paper craft, photos etc.

67. ANY HOME-MADE ARTICLE of wood, clay metal and/or any other hard craft (can be a pair or group)

68. ANY OTHER CRAFT

NOTE: Photographs must be taken by yourself. The Society will not accept responsibility in the case of dispute over ownership. Photos to be mounted on card - finished display not larger than A4.

Must be handed to Show Steward for displaying. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

69. PHOTOGRAPH of British Wildlife

70. PHOTOGRAPH of any British plant, flower, or vegetable

71. PHOTOGRAPH of any person/persons, living within the Parish

72. A COLLECTION of 4 PHOTOGRAPHS. One of each season, that captures for you, the essence of Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter. To be mounted together on a single card, not larger than A4.

73. YOUR FAVOURITE PHOTO

74. PHOTOGRAPH OF A GARDEN YOU HAVE VISITED in the past 2 years

75. PHOTOGRAPH OF "REFLECTIONS" – e.g. could be in water, glass or a mirror

76. A PAINTING in Oils or Acrylic

77. A PICTURE in any other medium (excluding photography)

CONNIE'S RECIPE.

6 oz soft margarine	6 oz caster sugar	6oz golden syrup	6 oz of plain flour
2 oz ground almonds	7 level tbsps cocoa	¼ level tsp bicarbonate of soda	
¼ pint + 2 tbsps of milk	2 standard eggs		

Mix all ingredients together until smooth. Place in 8 inch lined cake tin. Bake for 1½ hours to 2 hours at mark 2 (300°F/150°C). Cake should come away from the side of the tin. Cake to be iced.

ALL CUPS TO BE HELD FOR ONE YEAR BY THE WINNERS

NB. All Cups to be returned to Roseann Vince, 11 Sandpit Hill Cottages, Cholesbury (or other Committee Member) before the day of the Show. Thank you.

DEFINITIONS. As laid down by the Royal Horticultural Society.

BOWL	A vessel for displaying cut flowers in water or for growing bulbous plant and having a diameter at its mouth at least equal to, but usually greater than its height.
DISH	A specified number or quantity of a fruit or vegetable constituting one item which may be displayed on a table or on a stand or on a receptacle of any material and of any shape. Unless specially permitted in the schedule, a dish may consist of one variety only.
FOLIAGE	The leaves of any plant, or stems bearing only leaves.
FRUIT	In classes for floral arrangement "fruits" means seed pods, berries and ornamental gourds.
KIND	A term which is used in the classification of plants, flowers, fruits and vegetables for show purposes, e.g. delphiniums, roses and phlox are 'kinds' of flowers; apples, pears and plums are kinds of fruit. Peas, beans and onions are 'kinds' of vegetables.
SPIKE	A spike bears either stalked or stalkless flowers, as in peas, gladioli & foxgloves.
VARIETY	Used for all variations within a 'kind', e.g. Peace, Super Star, and Ena Harkness are varieties of roses.
VASES	A vessel for displaying cut flowers in water and having a greater height than the diameter of the mouth.

THE R.H.S. BANKSIAN MEDAL is awarded to the person who wins the most prize money in the Horticultural classes.

THE SOCIETY'S OPEN CHALLENGE CUP is awarded to the Exhibitor winning the most prize money in Divisions 1 and 2.

THE BEST IN SHOW CHALLENGE CUP to the Best Exhibit in Division 1.

THE FIRTH PRIZE is awarded to the Best Exhibit in Division 2.

THE SILVER CHALLENGE BOWL to the Exhibitor winning the most prize money in Division 1.

THE PHYLLIS O'CONNOR BOWL to the Exhibitor winning the most money in Division 3.

THE TOMLIN CUP to the Exhibitor winning the most prize money in the Dahlia classes 14,15,16 and 17.

THE BOWDEN CUP is awarded to the Exhibitor winning the most prize money in Division 2.

THE HODGSON CHILDREN'S CUP is awarded to the Exhibitor winning the most points in the Children's Classes 53 – 60.

THE LADIES CUP to the Exhibitor winning the most prize money in Classes 78 – 93 (Division 6).

THE O'BRIEN CUP to the Exhibitor winning the most prize money in Classes 61 – 68.

THE BASIL NEWALL AWARD to the winner of the most prize money in Classes 69 – 77.

THE JOHN HORN ALLOTMENT TROPHY will be awarded for the best allotment at Buckland Common. (Judged prior to the Show.)

THE STEPHENS AWARD will be presented for the most prize money won by a VILLAGER in the flowers, fruit and vegetable divisions.

THE CONNIE BROWN AWARD will be presented to the Winner of Class 89.
